8:00-12:00	<p>CE Course #1: What is Required in HUD Multifamily Radon Testing <i>Instructor: Shawn Price (Spruce Environmental)</i></p> <p>Course Description: This course will cover the basic testing protocols and goes beyond the standard in terms of emphasizing proper project planning, management, troubleshooting, reporting, and recommendations. It is commonplace that the certified testers are being asked to cut corners and test as few locations as possible and the radon professional needs to know how to anticipate these problems and be prepared to respond to them in a professional manner. Consultants are often eager to pass the liability down to the subcontractors and in this case, the radon professional is the one with the knowledge, experience, and credentials and should be in a position of authority when it comes to the radon portion of the project.
