

# Colorado Low-income Radon Mitigation Assistance Program (LIRMA)

If your home has high radon levels and you meet certain income requirements, you may qualify for a free radon mitigation system through the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE).

### You may be eligible if:

- 1) You own the home you live in.
- 2) You are a Colorado resident.
- 3) You qualify as a low-income household (this depends on your county).
- 4) You properly test your home for radon and the levels are higher than 4 pCi/L (picocuries per liter of indoor air).

### How to apply:

- 1) Go to [www.coloradoradon.info](http://www.coloradoradon.info) and click on the “low income mitigation assistance” link.
- 2) Read the policy and procedures manual.
- 3) Fill out the homeowner application.
- 4) Send in the required documents as indicated in your confirmation email from CDPHE:
  - radon test results
  - proof of home ownership
  - a copy of your mortgage statement
  - a copy of your Colorado identification

*We hope to give up to 100 families free radon mitigation systems each year.*
